The Teaching Pyramid Infant-Toddler Observation Scale for Infant and Toddler Classrooms (TPITOSTM) is the essential tool to ensure that infant and toddler teachers are using the Pyramid Model practices with fidelity. The TPITOSTM reliability workshop prepares participants in the use of the instrument to gather information on infant and toddler teacher implementation of the Pyramid Model practices. 
